Here is a look at where we are planning the infrastructure improvements.



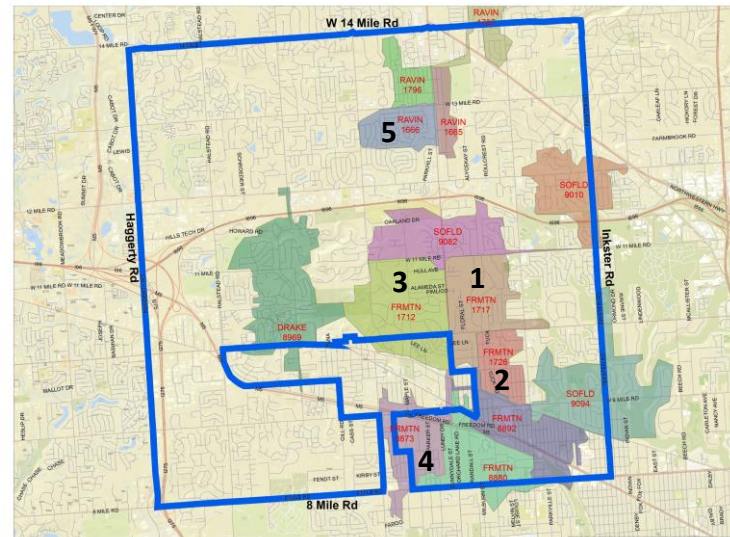
Actions we're taking to improve reliability

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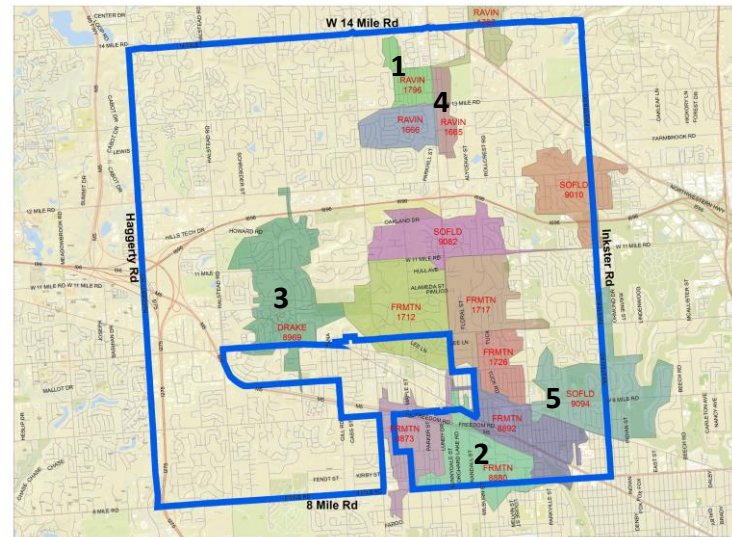

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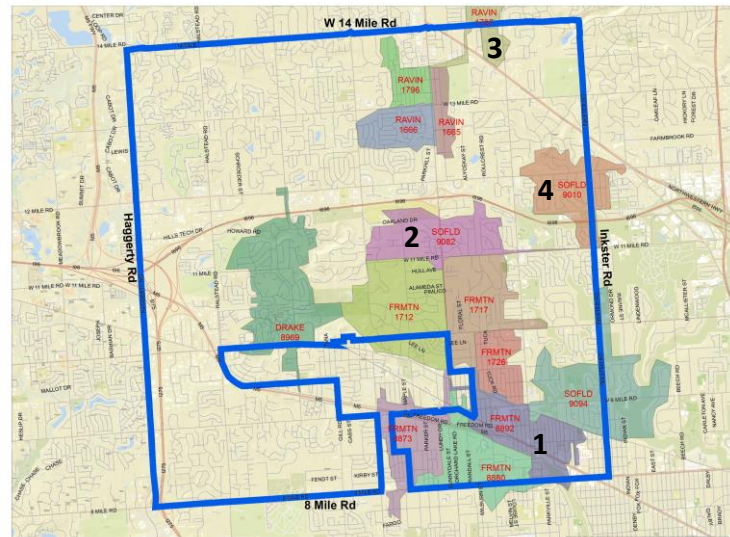
